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Maryland Career & Technology Student Organization Sweeps Louisville at National Leadership and Skills Conference

More Than Half of Maryland Competitors Finish in National Top Ten

BALTIMORE (July 12, 2018) – Maryland Career and Technology students challenged 6,400 other student champions from all 50 states, Puerto Rico, Guam and Virgin Islands, at this year's 54th Annual National Leadership and Skills Conference (NLSC) held in Louisville, KY. Over 100 Maryland students competed in 90 Career and Technology Education (CTE) program-aligned competitions, and brought home a record-breaking 27 medals. United States Department of Education Secretary Betsy DeVos attended this year's conference and expressed her support of CTE and the SkillsUSA student organization.

Conference attendees also celebrated two nationally-recognized Maryland advisors, Etta Maynard (Wicomico County) for honorary life membership and Marjorie Kellman (Washington County) for advisor of the year. Dorchester County's SkillsUSA chapter was recognized as a National SkillsUSA Models of Excellence recipient. Additionally, 2017 Graphic Communications national gold medalist Brittany Whitestone earned a spot on Team USA and will be travelling to Kazan, Russia in 2019 for the WorldSkills competitions, where Team USA will compete against the best CTE students from across the globe.

Demonstrating exemplary CTE training, Maryland students competing in Career Pathways-Industrial and Engineering Technology, Electronics Technology, First Aid/CPR, Graphic Communications, Medical Math and Promotional Bulletin Board are officially among the best in the nation, returning home with gold medals. Silver medals were awarded to students in Cosmetology, Diesel Equipment Technology, Humanoid Robotics, Quiz Bowl and Television (Video) Production. Bronze medals were awarded to students competing in Additive Manufacturing, Digital Cinema, and Nurse Assisting.

SkillsUSA Maryland has a statewide membership of 6,000 high school students. Members have consistently demonstrated their expertise and professionalism while participating throughout the year in a variety of leadership and competitive conferences. The Maryland State Department of Education, in cooperation with business, industry, and education partners, coordinates two annual statewide conferences to prepare students for this rigorous national competition. In April, Maryland CTE students representing 23 counties and Baltimore City competed at the 2018 SkillsUSA State Championships held at education centers throughout Maryland.
